Join us on an enchanting discovery of India, one of the oldest and most diverse civilizations in the world. Visit awe-inspiring monuments, explore bustling cities, and get lost in local towns and markets. Your trip begins in **New Delhi**- the capital of India. Immerse yourself in the markets and historic monuments of **Old Delhi**; explore **New Delhi**, the fast-paced, cosmopolitan capital that pays tribute to India's rich past, yet boasts modern architecture and sites of political importance. Explore **Humayun's Tomb**, and take a rickshaw ride through the bustling city streets to **Chandni Chowk**, one of the oldest and busiest markets in Delhi.

Continue to the royal city of **Jaipur**, often called "the Pink City" for the pinkish tint on the city's stone buildings. There, visit **Hawa Mahal**, also known as the "Palace of Winds," an unusual structure honeycombed with over 900 niches and windows. Continue to Agra and marvel at two of India's most famous architectural jewels, the **Agra Fort** and the **Taj Mahal**, one of the wonders of the world completed in 1648 by Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his wife Mumtaz Mahal.

An important stop is **Chennai**- the capital of the state of Tamil Nadu and a leader in information technology with a robust automobile industry. In the temple towns of **Kanchipuram** and **Mamallapuram** we will see 8th century temples and visit weavers and print makers who continue to produce exquisite sarees and other textiles; **Puducherry** will showcase the French influence still very present.

Our final stop is **Kochi**- one of the busiest ports in the south and a melting pot of European, Chinese and Persian influences. Here, wander through the narrow roads and spice shops, try your hand at fishing using the age-old Chinese fishing techniques or buy fresh seafood that will be cooked to your taste almost immediately.

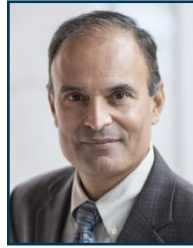

Venkataramanan “Ragu” Balakrishnan, the Charles H. Phipps Dean of the Case School of Engineering, received his B.Tech degree in electronics and communication engineering and the President of India Gold Medal from The Indian Institute of Technology, Madras, India in 1985, graduating at the top of the university. He received an MS degree in statistics in 1992, and MS and PhD degrees in electrical engineering, in 1989 and 1992 respectively, all from Stanford University. He was appointed dean of the Case School of Engineering at Case Western Reserve University in September 2018.

Balakrishnan is also a professor in the Department of Electrical, Computer and Systems Engineering; his research interests are primarily in the areas of control, and the application of convex optimization to problems from systems, control, robotics, communication and signal processing. Balakrishnan has held several volunteer and leadership positions in the systems and control community, including editorial positions at the IEEE Transactions on Automatic Control and the SIAM Journal on Control and Optimization.

PROGRAM ITINERARY

January 19/20, 2023 – Depart U.S.A.

Suggested departure for New Delhi. If you wish to spend a few extra days in New Delhi and wish to depart early, please contact Immersion Journeys.

January 21 – Arrive Delhi

Met on arrival and transferred to your hotel. India's capital Delhi is one of the most vibrant cities and leads the country in terms of art, culture, culinary experiences, shopping, entertainment and overall standard of living.

Trip briefing by guide/ tour manager. *Overnight: The Connaught- IHCL SelecQtions (No Meals)*

January 22 – Delhi City Tour

The historic tour begins at Jama Masjid, the largest mosque in India. Drive past the magnificent Red Fort, a marvel in red sandstone, built on the banks of River Yamuna by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan.

The 12th century Qutab Minar is a gracefully hand-carved for its entire height of 234 ft– a engineering marvel back in the day. Visit the mausoleum of emperor Humayun which was a forerunner of the Mughal style of architecture. The tour will also stop at India Gate, the President's Residence, Parliament House and the Secretariat buildings - an interesting blend of the Victorian and 20th century architecture.

Welcome dinner with limited bar. *Overnight: The Connaught- IHCL SelecQtions (B, L, D)*

January 23 – Delhi | Agra

Depart for Agra- home of the famous Taj Mahal.

Visit the Agra Fort. This fort was built by Emperor Akbar in 1565 and notable for its blending of Hindu and central Asian architectural styles.

Sunset visit to the famous Taj Mahal. Built by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jehan, this is a tribute of love for his favorite wife Mumtaz Mahal. This monument is an amazing feat of human industry and a perfect example of beauty, symmetry and aesthetics. Only when one enters the main gates and gaze upon the Taj, does the enormity of the task of building this mammoth structure hit the visitor. *Overnight: Taj View Agra- IHCL SelecQtions (B, L)*

January 24 – Agra | Jaipur

After breakfast drive to Jaipur with a stop at Abhaneri Stepwell– one of India's largest and deepest wells and a key water source. Step wells were a prominent feature in arid, desert environments and the main source of water for travellers and local villages for miles around.

Their intricate designs signified the prominence and wealth of the region and were often commissioned by local kings.

Arrive in Jaipur popularly known as “Pink City”. Jaipur is considered India’s first planned city where there is a clear segregation between residential and commercial areas. If time permits, the guide will take you on a walking tour through the historic markets and alleys where you will begin to get a sense of the urban design. *Overnight: Jai Mahal Palace (B, L)*

January 25 – Tour of Jaipur

Guided visits to Jaipur’s famous forts and historic places.

Visit the Amber Fort which is a classic, romantic Rajasthani Fort Palace, with its rugged, time-ravaged walls and fascinating palaces inside. Walk the ramparts of this imposing structure. Once you reach the top, you will get unobstructed views of the city below and the hills in the distance.

The City Palace is the former residence of the royal family and now a museum. Built in the style of a fortified campus, the palace covers almost one-seventh in area of the old city. One of the major attractions in the museum is the Armory Museum housing an impressive array of weaponry. Stop at Jantar Mantar, one of the largest stone and marble crafted observatory in the world. The observatory has seventeen large instruments, many of them in working condition.

**Due to animal cruelty concerns, Immersion Journeys refrains from offering elephant-backed rides while ascending and descending Amber Fort. Overnight: Jai Mahal Palace (B, L)*

January 26 – Jaipur | Chennai | Mamallapuram

Flight to Chennai. Met on arrival and travel by road to Mamallapuram.

This historic town of Mamallapuram (formerly known as Mahabalipuram) has various monuments built largely between the 7th and the 9th centuries, and has been classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The reigning kingdom in that era traded with China and Indonesia- a tradition expanded by the succeeding empire. Visit Arjuna’s Penance, an open-air bas-relief sculpture is built on a massive scale and depicts an episode from the Hindu epic, the Mahabharat; the Shore Temple, which is built close to the shore along the Bay of Bengal consists of five chariots, depicting one of the protagonists in the Mahabharat. Each imposing and greatly etched chariot is built out of a single rock.

Overnight: Radisson Blu Temple Bay (B, L)

January 27 – Day Trip to Kanchipuram

Kanchipuram is also known as the Golden City of 1,000 Temples and one of the seven holy pilgrimage sites for Hindus. Explore several 7th and 8th century temples that depict the Dravidian style of architecture. It is a city that is known for its silk weavers where you see exquisite saris come to life. *Overnight: Radisson Blu Temple Bay (B, L)*

January 28 – Day trip to Puducherry

Formerly known as Pondicherry, this important trading port gained prominence as a French colony (1664 – 1962) and its influence can be seen in the city planning, houses, language, traditions and of course food.

Puducherry's fame is also the presence of Auroville Ashram and international township and is probably one of the most successful communes in the world where you can meet people from all over the world of different professions residing here and contributing to the community.

Overnight: Radisson Blu Temple Bay (B, L)

January 29 – Chennai

As you return to Chennai, an important stop is at the Dakshina Chitra- a non-profit center for artists whose aim is to showcase a broader, more inclusive culture of the South Indian states. Take a walking tour of Chennai through a wholesale market teeming with life, color, cacophony exuberance. A visit to the heart of George Town is an experience as you navigate this neighbourhood and learn about its history, mythology and folklore giving you a glimpse of a “living” India. *Overnight: Taj Coromandel (B, L)*

January 30 – Chennai | Kochi | Kumarakom

Take a flight to the coastal port city of Kochi. Met on arrival and travel by road to Kumarakom. The village of Kumarakom is a cluster of little islands on Lake Vembanad and an enchanting backwater destination for is a perfect leisure getaway. *Overnight: Taj Kumarakom (B,L)*

January 31 – Kumarakom

Early morning visit to Kumarakom Bird Sanctuary for a guided nature walk to see indigenous and migratory birds.

The allure of Kerala are the small organic farms and their revolutionary methods of ensuring quality product. Visit one such place run by two women who follow strict guidelines on organic farming. It is a wonderful sanctuary away from the hustle and bustle. Enjoy lunch made of the freshest ingredients before returning to the hotel. The rest of the day is at leisure for you to enjoy the facilities and activities offered by the hotel. We highly recommend you try the various ayurvedic treatments on offer. *Overnight: Taj Kumarakom (B, L)*

February 1 – Kumarakom | Allepy | Kochi

Board your very own *kettuvallam* or houseboat that will take you through the famous Kerala backwaters traversing through paddy fields and villages and finally into the magnificent Vembanad Lake. The houseboat, which was earlier used for transporting goods across Kerala's

backwaters, is today a relaxed and romantic way to enjoy the tranquillity of the area. Lunch will be served on board.

Arrive in Kochi. The allure of a small seaport, the swaying of coconut palms, old buildings, and quaint streets all come together to make Kochi a lovely city. Kochi is also a natural harbor and because of this, people from around the world came here to trade, work and live and the influence of the Chinese, Dutch, French, Portuguese and British can be seen here. A great city to walk in, Kochi surprises you at every turn, greeting you with heritage buildings, old churches and temples, beaches dotted with Chinese fishing nets, small village schools, tiny restaurants and much more. *Overnight: Taj Malabar (B, L)*

February 2 – Tour of Kochi

Depart for a historic tour of Kochi with stops at the Dutch Palace, the Jewish, St. Francis Church and the Santa Cruz Basilica. Try your hand at the famous Chinese fishing nets which dot the harbor front; stop at Fort Kochi which was one of the original settlements built by the Dutch and Portuguese traders.

Enjoy a Kathakali dance performance this evening. Kathakali is as much a tribute to God and a form of prayer, as a folk dance. Kathakali dancers don elaborate costumes and masks to portray scenes from the Hindu epics Ramayana and Mahabharat and using intricate facial expressions and dance movements, to tell stories of love, valor, morality and adventure.

Farewell dinner with limited bar to close out this memorable trip.

Overnight: Taj Malabar (B, L, D)

February 3 – Depart Kochi

Check out and transfer to the airport to connect your International flight back home or extension (see options on the next page).

Due to the nature of the areas we will be visiting, this program involves some walking on uneven terrain or up and down stairs that may be steep or without handrails. On some days, it also covers long distances by bus. Every effort will be made to ensure your comfort; however, all participants are expected to be physically active and not be an impediment to others on excursions. OPTION 1:

The Golden Temple of Amritsar January 18-21

(Note: this itinerary is only offered as a pre-tour)

Located at the border of India, Amritsar is known as the home of Harmandir Sahib or Golden Temple, one of the holiest of Sikh temples and visited by thousands from around the world. This famous temple is covered in more than 100 kilos of gold and is a stunning sight to see against the backdrop of the setting sun.

ITINERARY:

Jan. 18 – Arrive New Delhi. *Pullman (B)*

Jan. 19 – Flight to Amritsar and evening visit to the Golden Temple. *Taj Swarna (B)*

Jan. 20 – Tour of Partition Museum (subject to it being open), Jallianwala Bagh and Wagah Border (to watch the daily rituals of the closing of the border between India and Pakistan). *Taj Swarna (B)*

Jan. 21 – Return to Delhi and join the main trip

RESERVATIONS AND PAYMENTS: A prepayment deposit \$1,000 along with a completed and signed Tour Reservation Form, and copy of passport are required in order to confirm your reservation. Upon receipt of these forms, a copy of your passport biometric page, proof of COVID vaccination and your deposit, we will confirm your trip. This Agreement. The right is reserved to decline to accept as a Tour participant, or remove from a Tour, without refund, any person Immersion Journeys judges to be incapable of meeting the rigors and requirements of participating in the activities, or who is abusive to other Tour participants, leaders or third parties, or who Immersion Journeys determines to detract from the enjoyment of the Tour by others. Specific room assignments are within the sole discretion of the lodge or hotel.

may cancel or postpone a Tour (or an option) for any reason whatsoever. Seasonal changes (for example, from low to high season) may result in higher prices.
