

## Tenure-Track Position in Medical Anthropology and Global Health

The Department of Anthropology in the College of Arts and Sciences at Case Western Reserve University invites applications for a tenure-track position in our program in medical anthropology and global health. The department invites applications at all ranks, although appointment at the rank of assistant professor is preferred. Applicants must demonstrate the potential for research, publication and extramural funding. In addition, candidates applying for consideration at a senior rank must possess national (Associate Professor) or international (Professor) reputations in research, a distinguished record of publication, and fulfill other qualifications necessary for a tenured appointment at our institution. The normal teaching load is two courses per semester and includes teaching undergraduate and graduate students. Candidates at all ranks under consideration must hold a Ph.D. or comparable degree by date of appointment.

All areas of medical anthropology are welcome but preference will be given to applicants working in international settings who will contribute to our program in Medical Anthropology and Global Health. Expertise in chronic disease, infectious disease, or in global health policy will have preference. All geographic areas are welcome.

Applications received by November 6, 2009 will receive full consideration.
