

Senior Faculty Search in Musicology/ Popular Music

Senior tenure-track faculty position in Musicology beginning 2010-2011, with a specialization in Popular Music Studies. The successful candidate will have an established scholarly record in popular music studies and will have demonstrated teaching expertise in areas that may include history and analysis, cultural studies, and technology. The candidate will be expected to collaborate successfully with colleagues in arts and humanities departments at CWRU and with external partners including the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Museum and the Cleveland Institute of Music. Applicants should demonstrate a strong commitment and innovative approach to teaching and research. Administrative experience working with artists, music industry representatives, technology staff, and funding agencies is desirable. The successful candidate will be expected to develop undergraduate/graduate curriculum and public programs in the area of popular music and will provide leadership in the ongoing collaborations linking CWRU and the Rock Hall.

Candidates should possess a doctoral degree or commensurate level of educational achievement. Normal teaching load in the department is four courses per year. Appointment at the level of Associate Professor requires evidence of excellence in teaching and research as reflected in publications, professional activities, and national reputation. Appointment at the level of Professor requires evidence of continued scholarly and teaching success as well a significant international reputation. Review of applications will begin on October 30, 2009 and continue until the position is filled.
