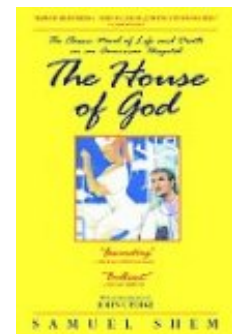

The three top scoring teams go on to compete at the APA Annual Meeting in the “Psychiatry Residency Bowl” and seven programs receive honorable mention for excellent scoring. The winners were announced at the AADPRT Annual Meeting in Tucson, Arizona. A certificate honoring this accomplishment is displayed in the case outside the offices of Drs. Stagno and Cerny. Research:

The Discovery and Wellness Center for Children is currently recruiting patients for participation in a research study for children and adolescents with symptoms of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder as well as other behavioral problems. Symptoms of ADHD include having trouble concentrating, a difficult time focusing, being extremely restless. Sometimes children with symptoms

of ADHD also experience behavioral problems such as breaking things that do not belong to them, bullying, or being aggressive towards other people. If you have a patient between the ages of 6 and 12, and his/her daily life is impacted by these disruptive behaviors, they may be eligible for this research study.
